## 2.0 SCOPE OF WORK

The Consultant shall provide professional services including reports, plans, studies, and mapping for the project. The scope of work for the Military Installation Resiliency Review includes but will not be limited to:

#### 2.1 Community-Led Assessment

- 2.1.1 Subject matter expertise to conduct research, analysis, strategic guidance, advising, resolution strategies, and outreach support.
- 2.1.2 Consulting services include, but are not limited to:
  - Review of climate vulnerabilities
  - Critical infrastructure both on and off the Installation
  - Opportunities to coordinate services between the Installation and the City of Box Elder
  - · Community engagement
  - How both military and civilian populations are affected

## 2.1.3 Assessment Tasks

- Facilitate Kickoff Meeting
- Facilitate community and committee meetings
- Prepare meeting materials; plan, organize, and schedule meetings, including the preparation and distribution of meeting announcements and agendas.

## 2.3.2 MIR Mapping and Geodatabase

 Risk and resilience maps that are included will give a clear depiction of locations of vulnerabilities and risks within the study area. All geospatial data used for compatible use analysis and/or map production will be submitted to OLDCC in Esri Shapefile format (\*.shp). Data will be readable within standard Geographic Information Systems (GIS) software (e.g., Esri's ArcMap, etc.), and it will be limited to the area around the project's Area of Interest (AOI) in order to omit unnecessary data. The military service and the community will confirm that all geospatial data is publicly releasable prior to delivery.

All geospatial data will include metadata in either the ISO 19139
 Metadata Implementation Specification style or the Spatial Data
 Standards for Facilities, Infrastructure, and Environment Metadata (SDSFIE-M) style. Metadata records for each dataset
 will include the minimum required information per metadata style
 written within the organization's preferred metadata editor
 software.

## 2.3.3 Final report

 A comprehensive report detailing exercise outcomes, identified strengths and weaknesses, and recommendations for improvement, including estimates and funding options.

#### 2.3.4 OLDCC Statement

#### 1.0 GENERAL INFORMATION

## 1.1 PURPOSE OF REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL (RFP)

The City of Box Elder is requesting a firm to lead a joint community/military assessment of shared vulnerabilities and risks associated with critical resources beyond military installation boundaries. This is necessary to support and maintain installation assurance and mission-essential functions. The selected firm will complete a cooperative, community-driven planning effort with definitive "next steps" to leverage the capabilities and strengths of state and local governments to address resilience and encroachment risks.

OThis Military Installation Resiliency Review (MIRR) and accompanying Tabletop Exercises must be completed by January of 2026 and will be conducted in collaboration with Ellsworth Air Force Base, the City of Box Elder, and other local agencies. Once the MIRR and Tabletop Exercise activities are completed, a corresponding report identifying challenges, risks and opportunities will need to be developed and presented to the stakeholders.

The City has received funding for consulting services through federal funds from the Office of Local Defense Community Cooperation (OLDCC).
